Oncology Services

To develop and deliver a Psycho oncology Service to patients and their families attending Mercy University Hospital, Cork. This includes collaborating on service design issues and the development of clinical pathways and quality initiatives alongside psychological assessment, formulation and treatment of patients on an individual and group basis, multi-disciplinary working, consultancy, liaison, research and teaching. These duties are to be carried out within professional ethics and hospital policies.

Overview of Responsibilities

- The successful individual will work with the team to develop a comprehensive psycho-oncology service.
- The successful individual will ensure the systematic provision of a high-quality clinical assessment and treatment service to reduce psychological suffering and promote psychological health and well-being of individuals within the oncology service.
- The post holder will offer psychological and neuropsychological assessment, formulation, monitoring, design and implementation of therapeutic interventions for patients with cancer. Innovative approaches to service delivery and therapy, on-going professional development and research will be required.

Eligibility Criteria

- The successful individual must be willing to work on a self-employed contractor basis and will not be a Mercy employee.
- A postgraduate doctoral qualification in clinical psychology with at least three to five years clinical experience is essential. Previous experience of working with cancer patients is desirable.
