The Mercy Urgent Care Centre treats:

- Suspected broken bones to legs (from knees to toes)
- Suspected broken bones to arms (from collar bone to finger tips)
- All sprains and strains
- Facial injuries
- Minor burns and scalds
- Wounds, bites, cuts, grazes and scalp lacerations
- Splinters and fish hooks
- Foreign bodies in eyes/ears/nose
- Minor chest injuries.



* above list should be recent injuries.

The Mercy Urgent Care Centre can take x-rays, apply plaster casts and stitches and has access to Mercy University Hospital services.

The Mercy Urgent Care Centre **DOES NOT** treat

- Children under 10 years old
- Injuries following a fall from a height or a serious road traffic accident
- Serious head injuries
- Chest pain
- Abdominal pain
- Gynaecological problems
- Serious neck/back pain
- Pregnancy related conditions
- Pelvis or hip fractures.



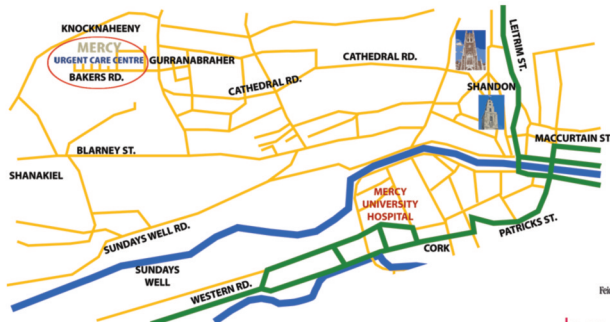
