Role of the Library

The Library's role is to support evidence-based clinical practice and the learning, teaching and research needs of the MUH staff and other designated users. It attempts to do this by providing access to:

- A study area with facilities conducive to reading and study and research
- Print and electronic information resources both locally and remotely
- Instruction in library and information seeking skills

Information Resources

Books (Print): The Library has a large collection of books covering most medical, surgical, nursing and allied health subject areas. Other subject areas covered include Philosophy, Ethics, Sociology, Economics, Law, History, Business and Management. The books are on open access and are catalogued according to the Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme.

Journals (Print): In recent years the Library has cancelled many of its print journals subscriptions in favour of subscriptions to the online versions.

Online Journals: The Library provides online full-text access to thousands of journal titles.

Databases: The Library provides access to the main health sciences bibliographic and full-text databases.

Facilities

There is a spacious and well fitted out study area as well as a computer room comprising of 11 PCs. The PCs have full Internet access, the requisite up-to-date software and printing facilities. The Library also provides scanning and photocopying facilities. There is also a group study room with online access.

Services

Borrowing: Library users may borrow 6 books for a maximum period of two weeks.

Document Supply Service: The Library provides a quick and efficient Inter Library Loan/Document Supply Service. Most journal article requests are satisfied within 24 hours.

Information Skills Training: The Library provides training to groups and individuals to help them identify, locate, use and evaluate the information resources needed to support clinical practice, learning, teaching and research.



The Application Process

Course places are available to registered nurses and healthcare personnel in the public and private health care systems and voluntary sector

Participants are able to enrol on available courses through HSEland by following the below steps;

- 2. Register/edit your profile (top right hand corner, see box below)
- 3. Click on 'Course Catalogues' (one of the headings, see below)



4. Scroll down and click on 'ONMSD' (see box below)



- 5. Click on 'Centre of Nurse Education, Mercy University Hospital, Cork'
- 6. Click on your place of work
- 7. Click on the course you wish to attend from the list of courses
- 8. Choose the date you wish to attend and click 'Enrol'
- 9. Provide the information requested
- 10. Please allow a few days for application approval. Please check your spam folder if approval is delayed.

Adult Peripheral Intravenous Cannulation Programme

Aim: The aim of this national programme is to enhance the knowledge and skills of registered nurses in relation to the theory and practice of intravenous (IV) Cannulation in adults.

Content: A blended learning approach is taken. The theoretical component can be accessed by registered nurses online via the HSE e-learning website www.hseland.ie and the practical components are delivered via the supervised practice workshops in the Centre of Nurse Education.

Intended Learning Outcomes:

On completion of the programme participants will be able to:

- Discuss the Scope of Nursing and Midwifery Practice Framework (NMBI 2020) as it pertains to the role of the nurse in the practice of adult IV cannulation.
- Discuss the theory and key skills pertaining to IV cannulation in adults.
- Discuss the importance of infection control measures in the practice of IV cannulation.
- Demonstrate and maintain competence in the skills pertaining to adult IV cannulation post skills demonstration and practice in the classroom setting and supervised assessment in the clinical setting.

Accreditation: 3 CEUs

Target Audience: Registered nurses working in the health service.

Facilitators: Centre of Nurse Education teaching staff

Participant Pre-requisites:

- Hand Hygiene Training must be completed within the last 2 years.
- Completed a full Medication Course (including IV Medication Training) and a refresher course every 2 years.
- A policy in the Organisation to support the Registered Nurse in the practice of Adult Peripheral Intravenous Cannulation
- A clinical assessor nominated by the organisation to supervise and support the participant to complete the clinical competency assessment.
- Participants are to access and complete the theoretical component of the Adult IV Cannulation Programme via www.hseland.ie and complete the online assessment.
- Copy of successful online assessment grade is to be presented by the participant to Lecturer on arrival at the Centre of Nurse Education.
- Complete and return Clinical Competency form to the CNE within **12 weeks** of completion of the programme
- Failure to return completed competency form to the Centre of Nurse Education within 12 weeks of completion of the programme will require the learner to repeat the component of the Adult Peripheral Intravenous Cannulation programme via www.hseland.ie, complete the online assessment, undertake again the practical component in the CNE and repeat supervised practice within the participant's organisation again.

Adult Venepuncture

Aim:

The aim of the workshop is to enhance the knowledge and skills of registered nurses in relation to the theory and practice of Adult Venepuncture.

Content:

A blended learning approach whereby the theoretical component can be accessed by registered nurses online via the HSE e-learning website www.hseland.ie and the practical components are delivered via the supervised practice workshops in the CNE.

Intended Learning Outcomes:

On completion of the programme the participants will:

- Discuss the Scope of Nursing and Midwifery Practice Framework (NMBI 2020) as it pertains to the role of the registered nurse and the practice of adult venepuncture
- Discuss the theory and key skills pertaining to adult venepuncture
- Discuss the importance of infection control measures in the practice of adult venepuncture
- Demonstrate competence in the skills pertaining to adult venepuncture on return to their work settings, following skills demonstration and supervised practice
- Understand the potential complications of adult venepuncture and manage effectively.

- Each participant needs to pass the online assessment in advance on HSEland in order apply and to undertake the practical component of the programme in the Centre of Nurse Education
- Copy of online assessment result/grade is to be presented by the participant to the Programme Facilitator on arrival at the Centre of Nurse Education
- Participants who do not present the assessment result/grade cannot undertake the practical component of the Venepuncture Programme
- This programme is designed only for Registered Nurses with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Ireland (on the live register)
- Hand Hygiene Training must be completed within the last 2 years.

- Complete and return Competency of Skill form to the Centre of Nurse Education within 12 weeks of completion of the programme.
- *Failure to return completed competency form to the Centre of Nurse Education within 12 weeks of completion of the programme will require the learner to repeat the component of the Adult Venepuncture Programme via www.hseland.ie, complete the online assessment, undertake again the practical component in the CNE and repeat supervised practice within the participant's organisation again.
- All sections competency form must be completed by the participant and nominated supervisor

Anaphylaxis Training for Healthcare Professionals

Aim:

To prepare healthcare professionals to correctly recognize and effectively manage patients who develop an anaphylactic reaction.

Prerequisites:

The Anaphylaxis Programme is available on HSELanD. Staff wishing to complete this course for the first time must complete the on-line version first. Then within 3 weeks of completion they should complete the one and a half hours skills component of this course at their local Centre of Nurse Education (CNE). They should book their skills component of this course first in the CNE via HSELanD to ensure they can be offered a place within 3 weeks of completing the on-line component.

Participants must have completed a BLS Programme for Healthcare Providers within the past 2 years. If you require a refresher course on BLS in advance of attending for Anaphylaxis programme please view BLS programme availability on Classroom management System on HSELanD

Workshop (2 hours)

- Anaphylaxis Quiz (Pre-Workshop)
- Preparing and drawing up 1st line medications
- Case management scenarios of adult, child and infant who develop an allergic reaction/anaphylactic reaction

Intended Learning Outcomes:

On completion of the programme the participants will:

- 1. Differentiate between severe allergic reaction and anaphylaxis
- 2. Discuss the management of the care of infants, children and adults with anaphylaxis
- 3. Demonstrate the calculations and preparation of appropriate drugs under current medication protocol
- 4. Discuss current RCPI National Immunisation Guidelines and other current evidence for the management of Anaphylaxis
- 5. Be knowledgeable of national guidelines for the management of Anaphylaxis

- 2020 AHA BLS Guidelines
- Adult BLS skills
- Use of Automated External Defibrillator
- Child BLS skills
- Infant BLS skills
- Adult, Child and Infant foreign body airway obstruction
- Management of victims of stroke and heart attack

The aim of the course is to enhance the knowledge and skills of registered Nurses in relation to the theory and practice of supra pubic catheterisation and enable the nurse practice competently.

Content:

- Standard precautions and appropriate PPE (Covid 19)
- Aseptic Technique
- Best practice in Supra Pubic Catheter Care
- Theory and practice of Supra Pubic Catheterisation
- Catheter-associated Urinary Tract Infection (CAUTI) Bundle of Care
- Supervised Practice Workshop

Intended Learning Outcomes: On completion of the programme the participants will:

- Demonstrate an understanding of the Scope of Nursing and Midwifery Practice Framework (NMBI 2020) as it pertains to the role of the registered Nurse and the procedure of Supra-Pubic Catheterisation

- Understand the importance of infection prevention and control in the procedure of Supra-Pubic Catheter care

Catheterisation- Urethral catheterisation in Females / Males (Adults) Programme

Aim:

The aim of the course is to enhance the knowledge and skills of registered Nurses in relation to the theory and practice of adult male and female urethral catheterisation and enable the nurse practice competently.

Content:

Day 1 Theory

- NMBI Professional Guidelines including Code of Professional Conduct & Scope of Nursing & Midwifery Practice.
- Revision of the anatomy and physiology of the adult female and male genito-urinary tract
- Indications, contra-indications and complications of adult male and female urethral urinary catheterisation
- Infection control and prevention in the practice of adult male and female urethral urinary catheterisation
- Evidence based knowledge and skill of adult male and female urethral urinary catheterisation

Day 2: Practical

- Practical Workshop on adult male and female urethral urinary catheterisation: Skills demonstration and supervised skills practice for each participant.
- Knowledge assessment
- Discussion on the Skills competency form for work settings
- Evaluation

The Nursing management of the adult with Type 2 diabetes: practical workshop programme

Aim:

This one-day practical workshop is designed to complement the knowledge and skills you have gained following completion of the eLearning modules:

- The Nursing Management of Adults with Type 2 Diabetes Mellitus on www.hseLanD.ie, and
- Diabetic Foot screening and protection on www.hseLanD.ie;

The aim of this practical workshop programme is to enhance those practical skills necessary to effect the optimum nursing management of the adult with T2DM. *All participants must present their certificate of completion of the online blended learning programmes to enable enrolment*.

Content:

- Blood glucose monitoring incorporating glucose meters, testing strips, injection devices and delivery, infection prevention and control, patient safety, injectables, injection technique and the management of hypoglycaemia
- T2DM Medicine Management in given scenarios/Case studies/Care planning; Q & A session
- Motivational Interviewing, integrating the five principles: Behavioural techniques.
- Assessment of the diabetic foot incorporating monofilament assessment, sensation, circulation, structural abnormalities, interventions and referral
- Healthy Eating and the management of T2DM, eating habits, portion sizes, food labelling, meal plans, food diaries. Referral pathways. (practical session).

Intended Learning Outcomes:

On completion of the programme the participants will:

:

- Through experiential learning and hands-on experience, observe and experience the optimal functioning and use of recommended blood glucose meters, insulin delivery devices and injectables, while promoting safe, quality patient care;
- Demonstrate prompt management of the adult with hypoglycaemia;
- Using role play, promote patient empowerment by utilising motivational interviewing techniques and specific behavioural approaches, positively influencing adults' selfmanagement of their diabetes.
- Demonstrate the importance of nutritional management through engagement in dietary demonstrations, label reading practice, meal planning and determination of portion sizes through problem solving activities and reflective discussion;

- Identify the characteristics of the 'at risk' foot through practical assessment techniques, promoting effective treatment decisions, initiating further investigations and knowing when to refer to and engage specialist services;
- Engage in medicine management of the adult with diabetes through varied practice based scenarios and reflective practice
